



Synnøve-Nordkap College Scholarship Application 2010

Synnøve-Nordkap Lodge is again offering college scholarships to active Lodge or Junior Lodge members or the children or grandchildren of active Lodge members. The number of scholarships to be awarded as well as the amount of the award will depend upon the number of highly qualified applications received as well as the state of the Lodge's budget. Although the Lodge reserves the right to award no scholarships, *this year's process is likely to be highly competitive.*

Applicants may be either college students or high school students who are entering college in Fall 2010 pursuing any course of study. Preference, though, will be given to those who have been active Junior Lodge and/or Lodge members themselves. Previous recipients of this scholarship may apply again.

Applications will be mailed to Rod Hale and **must be postmarked by May 15, 2010.** Completed applications will be initially reviewed and, if selected for further consideration, the candidates will be asked by May 21 to interview—either in person or by telephone—with members of the Lodge Board at its Board meeting on June 1. Candidate(s) who are selected for scholarships will be notified shortly thereafter. Any scholarship awarded comes with the expectation of either service to the Lodge and/or a contribution at a Lodge meeting or program, with the minimum being a short talk about what has been done with the scholarship received. In addition, the Lodge would like scholarship winners to be present at its picnic meeting on June 15, 2010 to receive the award formally and in person.

Application Directions

1. A completed application packet consists of:
 - a. The application form.
 - b. A short essay. Candidates who have not yet received a Synnøve-Nordkap College Scholarship are to address the following theme:

The Mission of Synnøve-Nordkap is to promote, preserve and cherish a lasting appreciation of the heritage and culture of Norway and other Nordic countries while growing soundly as a fraternal benefit society and offering maximum benefits to its members. Why would or how could the awarding of a Synnøve-Nordkap College Scholarship to you support this mission?

Candidates who have previously received a Lodge College Scholarship will write on this topic:

The Mission of Synnøve-Nordkap is to promote, preserve and cherish a lasting appreciation of the heritage and culture of Norway and other Nordic countries while growing soundly as a fraternal benefit society and offering maximum benefits to its members. What have you done during the past year as a Synnøve-Nordkap College Scholarship recipient to support this mission? Also, please describe how you have met the scholarship's expectation of either providing service to the Lodge and/or contributing at a Lodge meeting or program during the past year.

The essay should be one to two pages, word-processed and single-spaced, in length. Essays that contain spelling, grammar, and punctuation errors will negatively affect the evaluation of your application.

- c. An official high school--for applicants about to enter college--or college--for those currently in college--transcript complete to the time of application.
 - d. One letter of recommendation supporting your application for this scholarship. The letter should be from someone other than a family member and should address your personal and academic qualifications as a candidate. If possible, the letter should also speak about your contributions to the Lodge and/or Junior Lodge. Previous recipients of scholarships should provide new letters of recommendation.
2. Collect all components of the application packet and mail them together to:

Completed applications must be postmarked by May 15, 2010 in order to be reviewed.

3. Only completed application packets will be reviewed. The quality of the applicant is a necessary condition for awarding a scholarship. Preference will be given to candidates who have been active Junior Lodge and/or Lodge members themselves.
